APPRENTICESHIPS AND ADVANCED APPRENTICESHIPS IN WOOD OCCUPATIONS

Increased activity in the building industry has seen an increased demand for skilled carpenters and joiners. Apprenticeships provide the opportunity to meet this demand. Carlisle College can offer this type of training to a high standard through day release, off the job training and in support of the valuable on site experience.

The key elements of the course include the following modules.

1. NVQ Level 2
2. Functional Skills
3. Employers Responsibilities and Rights
4. Technical Certificate
5. Health & Safety test

1. NVQ LEVEL 2 UNITS

Mandatory units

- VR01 Conform to general workplace safety.
- VR02 Conform to efficient work practices.
- VR03 Move and handle resources

Optional units

Plus THREE of the following

- VR09 Install first fixing components
- VR10 Install second fixing components
- VR11 Erect structural carcassing components
- VR12 Maintain non-structural carpentry work.

- VR13 Set up and use circular saws.

Endorsements (one of:)

- Timber
- Non-ferrous metal

2. NVQ LEVEL 3 UNITS

Mandatory Units

- VR01 Conform to general workplace safety.
- VR209 Confirm work activities and resources for the work.
- VR210 Develop and maintain good working relationships
- VR211 Confirm the occupational method of work.
- VR09 Install first fixing components.
- VR10 Install second fixing components.

Optional Unit

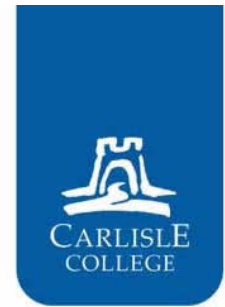
Plus TWO of the following

- VR11 Erect structural carcassing components.
- VR24 Erect complex structural carcassing components.
- VR25 Maintain non-structural and structural components.
- VR26 Set up and use fixed or transportable machinery.

- Metal working machinery

5. TECHNICAL CERTIFICATE

All apprentices must pass a Health Safety test as part of both the apprentices and advanced apprenticeship courses.
