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At Carlisle College, we offer degree level courses in a wide variety of subject areas designed to help you realise your career ambitions. Our degree students will have the opportunity to learn from industry-experienced tutors and guest lecturers while working on live briefs from professional leaders of your chosen industry.



We continually adopt and refresh the content of our degrees according to trends, working with local businesses to ensure that your studies are appropriate to the current demands of industry.

ACCESS TO HIGHER EDUCATION

Access courses are nationally recognised qualifications for adult students aged 19 or over. These specialised courses are designed to provide students who left school without qualifications such as A Levels with the skills, knowledge and confidence required to progress onto higher level qualifications such as Foundation or Honours Degrees.

CERTIFICATE OF HIGHER EDUCATION (CERTHE)

A Certificate of Higher Education (CertHE) qualification is a Higher Education degree course equivalent to the first year of a university Honours Degree. On successful completion of this Higher Education course, you may progress onto further study at university or within NCG.

FOUNDATION DEGREES

A Foundation Degree is a two-year career-focused qualification that is equivalent to the first two years of an Honours Degree. The aim of a Foundation Degree is to provide you with the employment skills and professional knowledge that you will need to be successful in your chosen career.

HONOURS DEGREES (TOP-UP)

An Honours Degree (Top-Up) is a one-year course designed to build on what you have learned during the two years of your Foundation Degree. Achieving an Honours Degree qualification will help you stand out in the competitive jobs market.

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HIGHER NATIONAL CERTIFICATE (HNC)/



HIGHER NATIONAL DIPLOMA (HND)

A full-time Higher National Certificate (HNC) is equivalent to the first year of a university degree, while a Higher National Diploma (HND) is equivalent to two years of a university degree. Both courses generally cover similar modules, although the HNC is one level lower than the HND.

Both HNC and HND courses are vocationally focused, meaning they are designed to develop the skills and experience required for students to enter directly into their chosen careers. Alternatively, HNCs and HNDs are excellent steppingstones onto a higher level qualification, 'topping up' either qualification with additional studies at a later date in order to gain a full degree.



ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

At Carlisle College, we can consider applicants for degree courses who have achieved the following qualifications:

- A Level
- BTEC
- T-Level
- International Baccalaureate
- Scottish Advanced Higher
- Access to Higher Education Diploma (approved by the Quality Assurance Agency (QAA))
- Diploma in Foundation Studies (Art and Design)
- NVQ Level 3 qualification
- Level 3 Advanced Apprenticeship.





We usually expect applicants to have achieved GCSE grade 4/C in English and maths by the point of enrolment. We will also accept Functional Skills Level 2 or Adult Numeracy and Literacy Certificates in place of GCSE English and maths for some degree programmes.

The costs indicated in the table above include tuition, examination and material fees (where applicable).

Programme fees are subject to annual reviews. You should expect to pay tuition fees for every year in attendance and be aware these fees may increase annually. On the basis of current guidance, and increase is unlikely to exceed the increase in inflation by reference to the Retail Price Index (RPI).

Every care has been taken to ensure that the fee information in this publication is accurate, but we reserve the right to amend the data if necessary.

TUITION FEE REPAYMENT

You'll only repay your student loan when your income is over the threshold amount for your repayment plan, unless you've been overpaid. Your income is the amount you earn (including things like bonuses and overtime) before tax and other deductions. The threshold amounts change on 6 April every year.

If you started your course on or after 1 August 2023 you will have a Plan 5 student loan.

You'll only repay this when your income is over £480 a week, £2,083 a month or £25,000 a year, at this point you will start paying back 9% of your earnings above the threshold.

HOW TO APPLY FOR DISABLED STUDENTS' ALLOWANCES (DSAS)

Full-Time Students

If you have already applied for Student Finance:

Sign into your Student Finance account to start your DSAs application.

The application for DSAs should be on your 'To-Do List'. If it is not, select 'Change your circumstances' to apply.

If you do not have an online account because you applied for Student Finance by post, use the DSAs paper application form.

If you have not applied for Student Finance:

You can apply for DSAs when you apply for Student Finance online.

If you do not need Student Finance, you can apply just for DSAs by filling in the DSA paper application form.

You cannot apply for Student Finance online once you have applied for DSAs.

Part-Time Students

Apply using the DSAs paper application form. You cannot apply online.

If you're already getting DSAs:

Claim back your expenses using DSAs paper application form.

How long does the application take?

You will receive confirmation of whether your application is successful within 6 weeks. It can take up to 14 weeks to get your DSA support in place as this is done separately.



The Business Management degree is aimed at those who are looking to explore the functions of business and gain a well-rounded understanding of how local, national and global markets operate. Whether you are seeking to start your own business, become self-employed, or join one of a wide range of small, medium or large employers, this degree will give you the skills and knowledge to develop and grow a business.

This course has been developed in collaboration with a variety of industry partners. You will work on live briefs set by industry experts, as well as having the opportunity to contextualise your course units according to the professional practices in your chosen field, as part of the Professional Development module.

Students who have completed a Higher National Certificate (HNC) in Business may be able to start as a second-year student. Students who have completed part of a HNC in Business will be exempt from studying certain modules and can switch to the Foundation Degree as a pathway.

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



HIGHER NATIONAL CERTIFICATE (HNC) IN CONSTRUCTION MANAGEMENT

Course Type: part-time

Duration: 2 years

Entry Requirements:

64 UCAS Points, Level 3 competent or Qualifications that are indicated as 'for England' are designed to meet the requirements of specific Occupational Standards.

WHAT THIS COURSE IS FOR?

The purpose of Pearson BTEC Higher Nationals in Construction Management is to develop students as professional. self-reflecting individuals able to meet the demands of employers in the construction sector and adapt to a constantly changing world. The qualifications aim to widen access to higher education and enhance the career prospects of those who undertake them. This course is for learners who are currently studying Level 3 and local persons who are currently in employment and require additional qualifications to increase employment prospects.

SPORT

This Foundation Degree (FdSc) programme aims to combine contemporary theory, innovative practice and industry experience to produce work-ready graduates who have an excellent knowledge and understanding of Physical Education and Sports Coaching.

This degree is an approved Higher Technical Qualification (HTQ) quality marked by the Institute for Apprenticeships and Technical Education.

While on the course you will develop important skills needed for preparation to work or progress in the sports industry, such as leadership, organisation, research and planning skills. You will explore topics involving the national curriculum, coaching and teaching styles, child development, differentiation in disability sport and psychology. The programme includes elements of work placement, this is a valuable aspect of the FdSc which enables learners to use experimental learning and apply theory into practice, whilst developing their own professional practice in their chosen field.

This degree course is aimed at graduates either currently in, or seeking to pursue, a career in the wider education sector. Developed alongside government and local education providers and informed by the most recent developments in educational research and government policy, you will analyse the many changes currently affecting the Further Education sector and develop your knowledge of various teaching approaches and techniques to become a skilled and reflective teacher.

This PGCE course focuses on developing your teaching skills and your knowledge about the subject you intend to teach. For this reason, you are expected to have a good understanding of your chosen subject(s) before you begin your training.

As part of the course, students are required to secure a voluntary placement in the Further Education or 'regulated' sector.



PGCE IN YOUNG PEOPLE AND ADULT LEARNING SPECIALISTS (PART-TIME)

Course Type: part-time

Duration: 1 year

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS:

- An Honours Degree and appropriate qualification in your teaching subject (minimum Level 3)
- 5 GCSEs at grade 4/C or above (including English and maths) or equivalent

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:

Admission to the PGCE in Young People and Adult Specialists course will include an interview with the Programme Leader and, where necessary, with the curriculum subject specialists to confirm that your subject qualifications and vocational experience can be matched with a suitable teaching practice placement.

DURING THE INTERVIEW:

Applicants will be expected to undertake a written task and a 15 minute microteach on a subject of their choosing. It is recommended that all applicants have experience in the vocational area in which they propose to teach prior to starting the course. This can be either paid or unpaid experience.

The Diploma of Higher Education: Education and Training is a Level 5 programme that focuses on developing your teaching skills and knowledge on the subject you intend to teach. For this reason, you are expected to have a good understanding of your chosen subject(s) before you start teaching.

As part of the course, students are required to secure a voluntary placement in the further education or regulated sector.

TEACHER TRAINING

The L3 Award in Education and Training is an introductory teaching qualification.

Completion of this qualification will provide assurances that new teaching staff members have the necessary skills and knowledge to prepare, plan, deliver and evaluate basic teaching and learning sessions, in a variety of teaching or training contexts.

This qualification is based around preparing and delivering a micro-teach session and may be undertaken by individuals who are not in a teaching role as there is no minimum teaching practice requirements. This makes it suitable for all Teaching Assistants with no teaching responsibilities.

Trainee teachers on this programme will begin to analyse the many changes currently affecting the further education and skills sector. You will develop your knowledge of some of the core teaching approaches and

techniques to become a skilled and reflective

teacher.

With the support from the experienced tutor, trainee teachers will receive real life examples and industry contact including workshops and placements to understand the complex, ever-changing and exciting world of teaching.

HOW TO FIND US



FROM THE RAILWAY STATION (10-MINUTE WALK)

From the station, walk straight ahead keeping the Lakes Court Hotel on your right. At the pelican crossing, cross over the road, and continue around the Crescent (keeping the statue on your left), and turn right onto Warwick Road past the Halston to the traffic lights and turn left along Spencer Street. Cross over onto the right-hand side, and keep walking straight ahead until forced (by pedestrian barriers) to turn right onto Victoria Place. Carlisle College is on your left.

FROM THE BUS STATION (6-MINUTE WALK)

On leaving the bus station onto Lonsdale Street, turn left. Continue down to the traffic lights and turn left along Spencer Street. Cross over onto the right-hand side and keep walking straight ahead until forced (by pedestrian barriers) to turn right onto Victoria Place. Carlisle College is on your left.

BY CAR FROM THE NORTH (M6 J44)

Exit M6 at junction 44, take the fourth exit following directions to Carlisle City Centre. Follow the road for 2 miles until you come to Hardwicke Circus roundabout, keeping in the left-hand lane. Take the second exit keeping DFS on the left-hand side and travel along Georgian Way. At the traffic lights take the filter lane to the left. Take the first left onto Compton Street, the college is on your right.

BY CAR FROM THE EAST (A69) OR THE SOUTH (M6 J43)

Travel along the A69 to Carlisle until you reach the roundabout at the A69/M6 interchange Junction 43. Go straight ahead over the motorway and follow the directions to Carlisle. Continue along Warwick Road for approximately 1-mile following signs to 'Colleges'. You'll reach a set of traffic lights with a right-hand fork. Take the right turn and continue along Victoria Place for approximately 400m taking the second road on the right Lismore Place follow the road round to the left. The college is on your left.
