In addition to this, we can help with behaviour, hearing impairments, visual impairments, and coordination and mobility.

TRAVEL

FROM A OR B TO COLLEGE FOR FREE!

When you join Carlisle College in September you may be entitled to free travel or help with the cost of getting to college. This is dependent on eligibility, household income and distance.

This support may be in the form of a reimbursement or a bus pass, depending on the cost of your travel. If you are not on a Stagecoach bus route we can still help with reimbursing you for mileage if you live where there is no public transport.

TO BE ELIGIBLE YOU MUST:

Live in a household with a gross income of £32,300 or less.

(Scotland household with 1 dependent child in education and gross income less than £24,421 or £26,884 with more than 1 dependent child in education).

OR

Live independently and be in receipt of benefits.

OR

Be a young person in local authority care or leaving care.





COURSE LEVELS

It can be hard to know which course and what level to start on. We have a course for everyone, regardless of your current grades, ability or ambitions. Once you've made an application to study with us, we'll review your application and work with you to ensure you start on a course that is best for you. Once you successfully complete that course you can progress onto the next level with us.

Full-time courses

The courses within this guide are studied full-time, requiring you to be in college most days. You'll focus on one core subject, and English and maths if relevant, learn in a hands-on way and be assessed in different ways.

Apprenticeships

Why not consider an apprenticeship? With an apprenticeship you'll be in full-time employment which you'll combine with off-the-job training either in college or in the workplace.

Which level should I choose?

The level you'll study at usually depends on the grades you achieve at GCSE. If you don't get the grades you'd hoped for, there's no need to worry. No matter what level you start at, if you successfully complete your course, you can then progress to the next level.

T-Levels are a new, two-year qualification designed to give you a head start towards your future career.

Designed together with employers, they bring college learning and industry placements together to give you all the skills and experience you'll need for an exciting career in industry.




Who are T-Levels for?

T-Levels are ideal if you have just finished your GCSEs and want to gain the knowledge and experience for employment, an apprenticeship or higher education.

You'll spend 80% of your time in college, learning both theory and hands-on skills, and the remaining 20% on a 45-day placement, gaining work experience with a real employer and putting the skills you've learnt into practice.

With a T-Level, you study one subject with different pathways, in order to gain in-depth knowledge and skills in your chosen area. One T-Level is equivalent to three A Levels, just like many of our other vocational courses are. Whether you choose an A Level, a T-Level or another Level 3 vocational course, you'll be awarded UCAS points which you can use if you wish to progress to degree level study. A T-Level Distinction is worth the same as three A Levels at A*.



WORK EXPERIENCE AND INDUSTRY PLACEMENTS

At Carlisle College, we believe that learning shouldn't be confined to the classroom, which is why all study programmes for 16–19 year olds include a significant amount of work experience.

Carlisle College has many years of experience working in partnership with leading employers throughout the region. Our Work Experience Team works across the College to help students find relevant, realistic and enjoyable opportunities.

TOP TIPS

Check out our top tips for studying an apprenticeship:

- Make sure you put the work in – you only get out what you put in.
- Never be afraid to ask questions – if someone else knows more about a topic than you, learn from them.
- Be sociable – it doesn't just help you make friends, but also helps you build strong relationships with your teachers.
- Always try to apply what you learn – the best way to use the knowledge you pick up in classes is to apply it with the skills you'll pick up from your apprenticeship.
- Try to have fun – juggling work and classes can be intense sometimes, but there's always a chance to have a laugh with people too. So be serious about your work, but don't be overly serious in your attitude.



FINANCIAL SUPPORT

Financial Support and Advice

Looking forward to coming to college but worried about money? We understand and we're here to support you on your learning journey. Our team of friendly staff are available to answer any questions or concerns you may have and will help you access any funding that may be available to you.

- Full-time students who are under 19 at the start of their course receive FREE tuition.
- Students aged 19+ in receipt of Job Seekers Allowance (including partners where the claim is joint) or Employment and Support Allowance (ESA) in the work-related activity group or universal credit may be eligible for FREE tuition.
- Students aged 19-23 and studying their first full qualification at Level 3 may receive FREE tuition.
- Help and advice on all aspects of financial support including bursaries, transport and childcare costs for eligible students.


19+ Learner Support Bursaries

19+ Learner Support Bursaries are dependent on household eligibility income of £37,300 or less you must be fully enrolled on a Further Education course which is funded by the ESFA (this doesn't include students enrolled onto community-funded courses, who aren't eligible for support) or you have an Advanced Learner Loan to cover the cost of your fees during the academic year. We can support with travel support as long as you live two or more miles away from the College.

Essential equipment, kit and trips are also covered by the College.

20+ Childcare Bursary

The Childcare Bursary is dependent on a household income of £32,300 or less and you must be fully enrolled on a Further Education course which is funded by the ESFA (this doesn't include students enrolled onto community-funded courses, who aren't eligible for support) or you have an Advanced Learner Loan in place to cover the cost of your fees during the academic year and have a household income of £32,300 or less. The childcare bursary will cover the cost of your childcare up to £61 per day for 0-4 years and £22 per day for 4-12 years – this includes breakfast and after school clubs! The childcare provider must be OFSTED rated 1 or 2.



Students aged 19+ studying at Level 3 and above (not Higher Education)

You can apply for an Advanced Learner Loan to help with the costs of a course at a college or training provider in England.

Loan eligibility does not depend on your income and there are no credit checks. Check if you're eligible before you apply for an Advanced Learner Loan. For more information please visit the Advanced Learner Loan website: www.gov.uk/advanced-learner-loan

The College will provide a 'Learning and Funding Information' letter with the information you'd need to apply, once you've been offered a place on your course.

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

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

Learn essential English Language Skills, practice English conversation and practice writing in English. A good variety of topics will be covered in the listening and speaking part of the course such as house and home, work and study, sport and leisure, travel and transport, and many others. 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



HOW TO FIND US

From the Railway Station (10-minute walk)

From the station, walk straight ahead keeping the Costa on your right. At the pelican crossing, cross over the road, and continue around the Crescent (keeping the statue on your left), and turn right onto Warwick Road past the Halston to the traffic lights and turn left along Spencer Street. Cross over onto the right-hand side, and keep walking straight ahead until forced (by pedestrian barriers) to turn right onto Victoria Place. Carlisle College is on your left.

From the Bus Station (6-minute walk)

On leaving the bus station onto Lonsdale Street, turn left. Continue down to the traffic lights and turn left along Spencer Street. Cross over onto the right-hand side and keep walking straight ahead until forced (by pedestrian barriers) to turn right onto Victoria Place. Carlisle College is on your left.

By car from the North (M6 J44)

Exit M6 at junction 44, take the fourth exit following directions to Carlisle City Centre. Follow the road for 2 miles until you come to Hardwicke Circus roundabout, keeping in the left-hand lane. Take the second exit keeping DFS on the left-hand side and travel along Georgian Way. At the traffic lights take the filter lane to the left. Take the first left onto Compton Street, the college is on your right.

By car from the East (A69) or the South (M6 J43)

Travel along the A69 to Carlisle until you reach the roundabout at the A69/M6 interchange Junction 43. Go straight ahead over the motorway and follow the directions to Carlisle. Continue along Warwick Road for approximately 1-mile following signs to 'Colleges'. You'll reach a set of traffic lights with a right-hand fork. Take the right turn and continue along Victoria Place for approximately 400m taking the second road on the right. Follow the road round to the left. The college is on your left.
